


Quick Start Guide: Using the Data Catalog Explorer on Northumberland Data Hub

Key Features of the Homepage



Main Navigation Menu

Located at the top of the page, the navigation menu includes:

- **Home:** Returns you to the main homepage.
- **Data:** Provides access to datasets categorized by themes such as:
 - Children & Young People
 - Crime & Community Safety
 - Deprivation
 - Economy & Employment
 - Environment
 - Health & Social Care
 - Housing
- **Population**

- **Tools:** Offers interactive tools including:
 - **Data Catalog Explorer:** Browse and search through available datasets.
 - **Custom Area Reporter:** Generate reports for specific geographic areas.

Quick Ward Profile



An interactive map feature allowing users to:

- Enter a postcode or click on the ward to view an overview profile.
- Access key statistics and insights at various geographic levels, including districts and smaller census areas like MSOAs and LSOAs.


